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DOUBLES IN BRIDGE			
Type of double	Who does it	Comments	
Take out double	First over-caller for your side	Need at least opening points; a shortage in the opener's suit (0-2 cards usually); support for other 3 suits; and no 5 card suit that you could bid. Partner <u>must</u> bid (best suit) unless there is an intervening bid	
Negative double	Responder to opening bid– ie (Partner opens and RHO bids)	You have points to respond (6-9 HCP at level 1) and support for the other 2 suits with at least 4 cards in unbid major. If first two suits were minors you should have 4+ cards in both majors	
Responsive double	Responder to take-out double	Redouble if no overcall after t/out, or double if opponents overcall. Shows both suits and partner to choose	
Support double	Opener	A double by opener to show 3 card support to responders major suit bid when opponents have intervened. If opponents intervene with double, a support redouble shows 3 card support	
Balancing double	Last bidder	Occurs when you overcall the openers bid from the 4 <sup>th</sup> seat. It is takeout double, but promises 3 fewer HCP's than standard takeout double. Purpose is either win contract at low level or to push opponents to higher level	
Lead directing double	Defender who will be after dummy	After artificial bid by Opponents (e.g. Stayman, transfer, ace count). You want that suit led.	
SOS double (redouble)	Opener	After 1C bid and double by Opponents. Wants rescuing.	

# MICHAEL'S CUE BID AND UNUSUAL 2NT OVERCALLS

Opener	Overcaller	Meaning of overcall
1C	2C	2 x 5 card suits; over minor – promises both majors; 8+ HCP;
1C	2NT	2 x 5 card suits; 2NT promises 2 lowest unbid suits = H & D; 8+ HCP's
1D	2D	2 x 5 card suits; over minor – promises both majors; 8+ HCP;
1D	2NT	2 x 5 card suits; 2NT promises 2 lowest unbid suits = H & C; 8+ HCP's
1H	2Н	2 x 5 card suits ;— over major promises other major and a minor; 8+HCP;
1H	2NT	2 x 5 card suits; over major - 2NT promises both minors; 8+ HCP
1S	2S	2 x 5 card suits; over major, promises other major and a minor; 8+ HCP;
1S	2NT	2 x 5 card suits; over major - 2NT promises both minors; 8+ HCP
