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Below are two of the many actions that may occur when a mistake is made and the **Director** is **Called**. Get to know these choices as YOU might have to select one in a somewhat stressful situation. Here are the options for an opening lead out of turn by defender and a revoke situation:-

# Lead out of Turn By declarer or dummy

A. During the course of play, North, the declarer, WINS the trick in dummy but then leads from his hand, or WINS the trick in hand and calls for a card from dummy. The DIRECTOR IS CALLED.

There are two options, either:

- The lead can be accepted by defenders either verbally or by the next player in rotation playing to the trick. Whichever action takes place first will have precedence.
- II. If the lead is not accepted, then the card played is returned to declarer's or dummy's hand. (Note that it is not necessary to lead a card of the same suit).
- N.B. Dummy may warn declarer about leading from the wrong hand, but not after declarer has led.
- B. During the course of the play North, the declarer, **DOES NOT WIN** the trick, but leads to the next trick from either their own or dummy's hand. The **DIRECTOR IS CALLED**. The options are exactly as in i) or ii) above.

### Revoke

The **DIRECTOR IS CALLED** because a player has revoked, that is they have failed to follow suit, when still able to. The most important question for the Director is "Has the revoke been established?"

The revoke is **ESTABLISHED** when:

- i) The offender or their partner leads or plays to the next trick.
- ii) If the offender was declarer and plays or nominates a card to be played to the next trick.

It is important to note that penalties (or trick adjustments as they are called in the 2017 Laws of Duplicate Bridge) are only assessed after a revoke has been established.

Up until the time of establishment, the revoke must be **CORRECTED** 

- i) by a defender, by playing a correct card and the withdrawn card stays on the table as a major penalty card.
- ii) by declarer or dummy, by playing a correct card and replacing the withdrawn card in their hand.

  (When corrected, non-offending players may change any subsequent card played to the trick and, if they do, then so can the offending side but the original card played becomes a major penalty card).

#### Notes

- 1. A revoke at trick 12 cannot be established and must be corrected.
- Defenders have the right to enquire of their partner about a possible revoke by saying "Having no more, Partner?" or words to that effect. Declarer has same right to ask Defenders and Defenders may ask Declarer. Dummy can only ask Declarer.
- 3. A claim or concession, by the offending side, automatically establishes a revoke.
