#### Playing card trivia for December from Richard Levy

Last week I was asked if I knew what the nickname for the **Jack of Clubs** was. Funnily, I did – it's Lancelot but I didn't know why and so I checked and it can be traced back to 16th-century French decks, inspired by the legendary knight of the Round Table.

Then I recalled some other odd nicknames I know and here are a few:

The **King of Hearts** is called '**the suicide king**' because he is pictured as stabbing himself with a sword, or at least holding a sword behind his head. The King of Hearts is also the only king without a moustache – but do you know why?

The **King of Diamonds** is called '**the man with an axe**' because this is the only king not carrying a sword. He is also known as '**the one-eyed king**' – all the others you can see both their eyes.

The **Queen of Spades** has lots of nicknames – among them the '**the Bedpost Queen**', '**Dirty Gertie**' and '**Molly Hogan**' – I wonder who she was?

If you're of Scottish descent you may consider the **Nine of Diamonds** to be an unlucky card. Its nickname '**the Curse of Scotland**' goes back to the 18th century. The orders for the Glencoe Massacre of 1692 ('Kill them all', which resulted in the slaying of 38 Highlanders), were written on a Nine of Diamonds card.

The **Seven of Diamonds** is known as '**the beer card**'. It originated in Denmark and the partner of a Bridge player who wins the last trick of a hand with a Seven of Diamonds must buy his/her partner a beer!

The **Four of Clubs** is known as '**the Devil's Four-Poster Bed**'. This name is derived from the design of the pips on the card, which can be imagined to be the four posts of a bed. No-one really knows why but this card is considered by some superstitious folk to be a curse, apparently ruining any hand that includes it – watch out!

#### Finally, some collective names:

**Aces** – Bullets or Seeds

**Kings** – Cowboys or Monarchs

**Queens** – Ladies or Mop-squeezers

**Jacks** – Fishhooks or Valets

If you know any others, do let me know – we're holding history in our hands with every card we play.
